
pipe or cigarettes; eating or drinking intentionally and sexual



with a group of angels and passes on mercy to each one of the servants or prays for his forgiveness who whilst standing or sitting is incanting *dhikrullah* or engaging himself in worship. On the Day of *Eid (al-Fitr)* Allāh the Almighty because of these servants takes pride amongst the angels saying, 'O the angels! What is the remuneration of the labourer who completes his job?' The angels beseech, 'O our Sustainer! His remuneration is that he should be given full credit.' Allāh the Almighty says, 'O my angels! My servants, male and female, have discharged their duty. Then they set out of the houses for supplication at the *Eid Gahs* (Meeting Place for the Eid Prayer). I swear by My *Dhāt*, Majesty and All-Forgiveness, Grace, Highness, and Excellence that I shall accept their supplications.' Further, Allāh the Almighty says, 'O My servants! Return to your houses. I have forgiven you, changed your sins into good deeds."

The Holy Prophet said: "The Muslims return from Eid Gahs in the state that their sins are forgiven." – (Behaqui/ Misahkat Sharif V1, P355, No. 1983/Tartib Sharif, p 821-22)

Supplication of Laylat-ul-Qadr

Hadrat 'A'isha Siddiqua المناسخة has narrated that she beseeched the Holy Prophet المناسخة; "Please tell! If I come to know the Night of Power, what shall I recite i.e. what supplication should I proffer?' "The Holy Prophet المناسخة said: 'Say this once:
